## Editorial

## Consumer Rights

Our country celebrates National Consumer Rights Day on 24th December every year to spread awareness about consumer rights and responsibilities. Consumer rights are now an integral part of our lives like a consumerist way of life. On this day in the year 1986, India's Consumer Protection Act came into effect. So, the day is observed to make people aware of their rights as consumers to avoid getting exploited. As a consumer, one should know how market products are constantly under-weight, of inferior quality and do not prescribe to quality standards specified by quality-control agencies. Today the consumer choice is influenced by mass advertising and other promotional devices which make people want things which neither they really need nor they can afford. Consumers not only do not get value for their money but also often have to suffer losses and inconvenience due to market manipulations. The Consumer protection law applies to the goods and services we buy every day, from grocery items and whitegoods, to vehicle repairs and hairdressing services. Consumers are legally entitled to a refund, repair, replacement or repeat service if there is a problem with any goods or services they buy. In our country, buyers have a very weak bargaining power and cannot assert their right being heard. Consequently, manufacturers and traders are tempted to follow diverse practices which turn out to be unfair to consumers.

Consumers therefore have an important role to play in persuading food companies and butchers to make the changes that are needed to stop the global public health threat for prudent use of antibiotics and protect the drugs for the future. Mahatma Gandhi said that "A customer is the most important visitor on our premises. He is not dependent on us. We are dependent on him. He is not an interruption in our work -

he is the purpose of it. We are not doing him a favour by serving him. He is doing us a favour by giving us the opportunity to serve him." India is one of the few countries in the world, which has exclusive courts for consumer redressal and is known for the rapid development of its consumers' movement. World Consumer Rights Day (WCRD) is a fantastic annual celebration that unites consumers around the world. In fact the original Consumer Protection Act, 1986, was meant to ensure that the consumers themselves argue their cases in a friendly atmosphere but the experience has been different. One must remember that businesses can't refuse to help, nor simply refer consumers to the manufacturer. There are many businesses do, as a matter of goodwill, give refunds and exchanges even when legally they don't have to, so consumers should make a habit of checking a store's refund policy before purchasing. "The law helps those who help themselves." Hence consumerism is necessary. Self-regulation by business will minimize the need for extensive government intervention. In order to check the onslaught on consumers, a host of legislations are implemented by the government. These include Sale of Goods Act, 1930; Essential Commodities Act, 1955; Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954; Prevention of Black Marketing and Maintenance of Supplies of Essential Commodities Act, 1980; Standards of Weights and Measures Act, 1956; Agricultural Products and Grading and Marketing Act (AGMARK), 1937; Indian Standards Bureau Certification Act, 1952; MRTP Act, 1969 etc.

Despite the various check and balances put in place by various institutions, we still have crimes. The only way to stem the cases arising from newer forms of technology is through consumer education.

## Air pollution increases the lifelong risk of heart disease, stroke and cancer

Today in the name of development that the urbanization and industrialization is taking place hastily is a problem than solution for human misery. It echoes the grave concern of each and every urban living Indian. Unplanned and haphazard urbanisation is the root cause for all the pollution related problems. The green building movement is an attempt to minimize and eliminate negative impacts

and maximize environmental, economic and community/human benefits. Constructing green buildings effectively reduce air pollution through reduced energy use, the use of appropriate refrigerants, and the use of materials with low off-gassing and other steps. The reduction in use of fossil fuels at the building site also results in lower air pollution contributions at the site, while reduction in electricity use results in lower air pollution associated with power plants. It is clear that if a builder is constructing a green building, he can jump the queue waiting for an environmental clearance. The release of gaseous pollutants from burning fuel of motor vehicles, industrial processes, burning of garbage, etc are contributing to the air pollution.

In its worst spell of importunate pollution in nearly two decades, the Capital's air quality slipped into the 'hazardous' level. It reveals that the levels of air pollution remained "severe", the highest warning as per the National Air Quality Index.

India comes just behind China - which witnessed an estimated 800,000 deaths - says the study, which relied on mathematical modelling to arrive at its figures. A number of occupational and environmental factors are also associated with an increased incidence of lung cancer. Emergency measures have to be put in place. People with heart or lung diseases, older adults, and children are to be advised to remain indoors and keep activity levels low. Vehicle density is too much in Delhi and the traffic jam is the main culprit for the ambient air quality deterioration. It is callous and irresponsible on the part of the Delhi government, which hasn't told its people that the air quality is so bad that they should not step outside to exercise or allow their children to play. The air pollution is increasing due to indiscriminate industrialisation. As far as addressing the issue of air pollution is concerned, the authorities are more at fault for not devising and



implementing proper system for disposing off the waste generated. Every body has a right to clean air. Planting trees in every corner is essential to improve the quality of the air. The strategy should focus on stop the pollution and improve the quality of air.

It's not just the big cities in India which are choking children with its bad air. Around the world, one billion children live in homes where solid fuel is used for cooking

and heating - a vital cause of indoor pollution. Nearly 6 lakh children under the age of five are estimated to die every year from diseases caused or exacerbated from indoor and outdoor pollution. Globally, an estimated 2,000 children under the age of five die every day from diarrhoeal diseases and of these some 1,800 deaths are linked to water, sanitation and hygiene. Children are also exposed to harmful chemicals through food, water, air and products around them. Air

pollution also increases the lifelong risk of heart disease, stroke and cancer. We need to make people aware that their activities should not release more emission when our air is already so polluted. It is to be remembered that every child is important. ## Attack on farmer in Vallabhipur, Patidars in hot water



**Overnight meeting called, convoy of more than 100 cars left from Surat, big meeting in Kalatalav village in the evening**

Surat, In Kalatalav village in Vallabhipur taluka of Bhavnagar, three people fatally attacked an elderly Patidar farmer with a spade handle yesterday, Thursday. This incident sparked widespread anger among Patidars. Two thousand Patidars held an urgent meeting in Surat late last night. In which it was decided to go to Kalatalav village and hold a massive meeting. Under which a convoy of more than 100 Patidars left from Surat this morning.

What was the incident? On Thursday, August 7, at around 10 am in Kalatalav village, an elderly Patidar farmer named Arjanbhai Deora was filling his tractor with soil from the LIndia river

when three men, Raju Ulva, Natha Rabari and Mamaya Rabari, hurled abuses at him, saying, "Is this soil your father's? Why are you filling it?" After that, when Arjanbhai said that this was a public river, Raju got agitated and started beating him with the handle of a spade. The injured old man was rushed to Sarti Hospital in Bhavnagar via 108. 74-year-old Arjanbhai, who has studied up to standard 6, lives with his wife in Kalatalav village of Vallabhipur taluka. He has three sons among his children and all three sons currently live in Surat.

The police have registered a police complaint against the three attackers. Out of which, Vallabhipur police have arrested accused Raju Ulva and he will be taken to Bhavnagar for further investigation before Bhavnagar Range IG Gautam Parmar.

Overnight meeting held in Surat, 2000 Patidars present. The repercussions of this attack have been felt in Surat. A coordination meeting of Patidars was held in Surat on August 7 to get justice for the aggrieved elderly farmer. More than 2000 Patidars attended this meeting. After that, the people of the Patidar community left for Kalatalav village with a convoy of more than 100 cars, where a public

meeting has been organized today (August 8, 2025) at 5 pm. Patidars from the surrounding villages and Surat will be present in this public meeting.

Three anti-social elements attacked an elderly man with a shovel

In Kalatalav village, three anti-social elements - Raju Ulva, Natha Rabari and Mamaya Rabari - attacked a farmer named Patidar Arjanbhai Ramjibhai Deora with a weapon after he tried to take two sacks of sand from the village canal. Regarding this serious incident, a coordination meeting of more than 2000 Patidars was organized by the Patidar Seva Sangh in Surat at a farm located in Katargam,

in which a large number of community leaders were present.

Patidar public meeting to be held at 5 pm today.

Community leaders told Divya Bhaskar that the fear of anti-social elements is increasing day by day in the villages of Saurashtra. To stop this fear, the community needs to unite, the Patidar community had called for strictest action against such anti-social elements and expressed its anger. A convoy of about 100 cars from Surat was set to leave for Kalatalav village, where Patidars will participate in a public meeting at 5 pm today, Friday.

A large number of community leaders including community leaders Vijaybhai

Mangukiya, Abhinbhai Kalthia, Alpeshbhai Kalthia, Ashokbhai Adhewad and others were present in the coordination meeting of Patidar Seva Sangh. After that, the leaders along with the youth and leaders of the Patidar community started leaving in cars at night itself. This morning, the last convoy of cars left for Kalatalav village in Bhavnagar.

"This soil does not belong to your father, why are you filling it?"

According to the police complaint filed by Arjanbhai Deora, he had gone to fill the LIndia river on the way to Vadod village in Kala Talav. At this time, Nathabhai Bhimabhai Ulva of his village refused to fill the soil.
